Board Approves Supervisor Rickman's Proposals to Provide District Five Funds in Support of Local Programs

STOCKTON – At its Board meeting on Tuesday, June 2, 2026, the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors approved Supervisor Rickman's proposals to provide dedicated District 5 Funds to several worthy programs serving the Tracy area.

Tracy Theater Arts Collaborative (TTAC) will receive \$11,393 to cover costs for equipment needs. The TTAC is a non-profit production house and community of individuals of all ages that come together to share, learn, and celebrate the art of theater. As a nonprofit organization, they are dedicated to making theater accessible to everyone, nurturing talent, and supporting the artistic journey of each individual who walks through their doors. This funding will provide equipment in support of a curriculum teaching theater performing arts from ages 7 to 75 years old and has a special objective to reach out and work with the schools in their drama programs.

Community Partnership for Families of San Joaquin (CFP) will receive \$9,220 to cover costs for equipment and furnishing needs. CFP provides tools, resources, and connections to help families improve their quality of life. Through their Family Resource Center model, they offer wraparound, family-centered services that address economic stability, health, education, and overall well-being. Their Tracy site represents a strategic expansion of services into a high-need, high-opportunity location. This funding will provide a functional, welcoming, and trauma-informed space ensuring residents feel comfortable accessing services.

West High School Home Field Advantage Booster Club will receive \$9,139 on behalf of the Air Force JROTC Program for campus projects and equipment needs. West High students have come together and taken initiative to start community projects aimed at improving the campus in several areas. This funding will be used to complete projects such as repainting the baseball field and upgrading their weight room for all West High sports. The Supervisorial District Funds were re-established by the Board of Supervisors in the 2023-2024 Adopted Budget, to afford each supervisor the opportunity to address district-specific unmet needs. Supervisorial district-funded projects are subject to existing County policy and business practice.

Fifth District Supervisor Robert Rickman stated, "These investments reflect my commitment to strengthening the organizations that make a difference every day in the lives of San Joaquin County residents. By supporting youth development, family services, and the arts, we are investing in opportunities that enrich our communities and improve quality of life for generations to come."
